





### **PORTLAND SERRA CLUB**

The Portland Serra Club has been very active in expanding our clubs focusing on the development of a new club in the Southwest section of Portland. Father John Henderson, former Archdiocese Vocations Director and past Chaplain of our Portland club, will be the Chaplain of this new club. In late April, a presentation was made by Dan Jones at the Masses at the parishes involved, with an invitation to an introductory meeting. The introductory meeting was held on May 20 with approximately 25 potential members in attendance. The goal is to have at least 25 individuals who will have committed to forming this new Serra club. Our second meeting was held on June 17<sup>th</sup>, which started with a round table discussion over a light dinner! Progress is being made! Sarah Kresse, Salem Keizer Club Serran & St. Joseph's/Salem Youth Ministry and Vocations, was our guest speaker and she was highly energized and motivational. The ultimate goal is to have a charter celebration for this new Serra club on October 28, 2015. This celebration would include Mass, (celebrated by Archbishop Sample) a dinner, and presentation of the charter.

The Portland Club has continued with its usual activities: In February we held our annual Priest Appreciation Dinner which was well attended and a wonderful event. In March, the club hosted an annual dinner event with Portland Archdiocese seminarians and families at St. Patrick's Parish. The Portland and Salem clubs co-sponsored with the Archdiocese Vocations Committee the annual Vocations Rally which brought about 400 sixth graders to the two events.

In May, three Portland Archdiocese seminarians were ordained as Transitional Deaconates and on June 5, we are delighted to say 8 Transitional Deacons were ordained as priests. It was a full house at St. Mary's Cathedral!

Promotion activities geared to bringing new members into the club were led by a club membership drive in June. This year the Portland club is honoring Deacons and their wives at our annual Mass and brunch at the Grotto on July 26.

### **COLUMBIA RIVER SERRA CLUB**

Columbia River Serra hosted its 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Vocations Benefit dinner on January 31<sup>st</sup> with over 500 youth, adults, and religious attending. Proceeds from this dinner go to support Quo Vadis and other vocation events in the Archdiocese of Seattle.

Columbia River Serra supported in the New Connection Program, helping to connect graduating seniors at area parishes and Seton Catholic High School with the college campus Newman Centers. We provided an overview of the Newman Connection Program and Newman Centers to the graduating class at Seton Catholic, and provided material to youth leaders to get students connected. The group is actively preparing for Quo Vadis Day in the Archdiocese of Seattle on June 28<sup>th</sup>-July 1<sup>st</sup> at Camp Don Bosco. Columbia River Serra rents a bus to get the boys to and from the camp, and provides lunches on the last day.

Club members continue to write letters of support to all the seminarians in the Archdiocese of Seattle. Columbia River Serra 2015 officers were elected in the spring and installed on Saturday, June 6<sup>th</sup> at St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church. The 2015 President is Robert Conser and President Elect is Shirley Buckmier. Our current Serra Chaplain, Father Matthew Oakland, is being transferred to Holy Rosary Catholic Church in Seattle effective July 1<sup>st</sup> and our group will be assigned a new chaplain in the coming months.

### **SALEM SERRA CLUB**

The health of our club is good, although we have no new members this year. In December, the club got together with the clergy at a coffee shop and had fun guessing who was who from a short list of answers to a few questions.

As Lent approached, they celebrated Mardi Gras with the seminarians by hosting a couple of cookie and sweets tables. This was great opportunity for Serrans to chat with the seminarians one on one. In April Salem's speaker was James Thurman, a member of the Adult Faith Formation staff from St. Joseph Parish.
