2014 Serra International Convention

Serra's 72nd International Convention held in Sacramento was an answer to our prayers for reconciling the ongoing dispute between our organizations. The theme "The Path to Holiness" started with an evening Mass in the beautiful ornate Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament. Following mass was a Eucharistic Procession of the Blessed Sacrament a distance of two long city blocks to the Trinity Room of the Hyatt Regency where the Convention was being held. The fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus acted as honor guard and the church choir accompanied the procession. People along the street paused in silent respect of the occasion.

The first evening a social hour was hosted by Dan Jones, outgoing president, and Bob Labat, incoming president of the United States Council, with a special invitation to members of the Serra International Board. This was a first and highly successful in bringing about meaningful communications amongst the respective board members.

The Friday sessions started with a two-hour Spiritual Retreat for Serrans presented by Very Rev. John Horn, S.J. It helped set the spiritual atmosphere of the entire convention. Mass at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament followed at noon.

Serra International President, Sean Yeo, gave his State of Serra address. I could not help but marvel at the guidance of the Holy Spirit in both the selection of him as our leader in these troubled times but also the inspired wisdom and charity that governed his actions throughout the convention. He started the session with the recitation of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and on another occasion the recitation of a decade of the rosary. He and Dan Jones along with many others brought about the long overdue reconciliation that was needed.

The hiring of the new Executive Director, John Liston brought about a complete change in management. For the first time in over 14 years we were provided an audited financial statement of the business affairs of Serra International. Changes in the now combined offices of Serra International and United States Council have resulted in drastic reductions of managerial expenses. Attendees at the convention came away with new enthusiasm as a result of the cooperation of the two entities.

Serra International put out a "Handbook for Serrans Called to Holiness". I recommend that each and every Serran obtain a copy for their personal use. Part I covers the "Essentials of a Serran's Spiritual Life" and part II covers the "Essentials of the Catholic Faith." The first role of a Serran is to grow in holiness so we can do God's work.

A new dawn is awakening in Serra. We simply need to cooperate with the Holy Spirit in his guidance of our activities to accomplish good results.

Behind the scenes, Serra Members in Eastern Washington have been busy this summer preparing for an active 2014 Fall season.

Participating in several conference calls with USAC's Membership Committee Chairman, Mark Bonkewietz and USAC's Membership Retention Team, The Tri-Cities and Spokane Serra clubs have been diligently gearing up for their 4th quarter Membership campaigns and working to achieve the 15% membership increase per year for the next three years.

Deserving an honorable mention, the Tri-Cities membership campaign titled, **9 Missions 9 Members**, incorporates a unique focus and obtainable challenge. While praying the 9 Missions of Blessed Junipero Serra Novena, each Serra Member is asked to focus on the intention of recruiting 9 new members. 

The **Columbia River Serra club** has a new club chaplain – Father Mathew Oakland from St. Thomas Aquinas parish in Camas. Also they have changed their meeting dates to the first Saturdays of each month, beginning with the 9:00 A.M. Mass.

The club helped to provide funding and assisted with meals and transportation for the 140 plus boys who participated in Quo Vadis Days in June. The club also provided support for the third annual “Pedaling for the Priesthood” activity on July 7-9. Vocations Director, Father Bryan Dolejsi, along with other priests and seminarians of the Archdiocese, biked throughout the Southern Deanery promoting vocations at area parishes.

The Traveling Monstrance for Vocations started at St. James Church and several of our members traveled with it up the I-5 corridor to the Cathedral in Seattle.

Several members from Columbia River club participated in the Serra Spring retreat in Tacoma. Father Kenneth Baker S.J. was the retreat master and spoke on “the Peace and Joy of being Catholic in Good Times and Bad”. His second topic was “Vocation, Priestly formation and the Will of God”.

The club also will participate in several holy hours and masses dedicated to vocations to the priesthood and religious life during National Vocations Week in November. The events will be advertised in parish bulletins and the club website.

The new president-elect for the Vancouver club, Robert Conser, attended the Region 12 Spring Leadership Conference. Our next election for new officers will be held in February and the new officers will participate in the spring leadership conference in Kennewick.

The Columbia River Serra club is beginning the planning efforts for their 5th annual vocations benefit dinner to be held on January 31. Our keynote speaker will be Archbishop Sartain.

The **Portland Serra Club** inducted Paul Harris as their new president. The club also has a new chaplain, Reverend Jeff Eirvin. Father Jeff brings much enthusiasm and optimism to our Serran mission.

On October 19th the Portland Club’s annual Sisters’ Appreciation luncheon will be held at the Double Tree Lloyd Center. The Sisters turn-out for this event is always tremendous. It is a function in which Portland Serrans participate and are rewarded by the enthusiasm of all the Sisters in attendance.

The **Salem Serra Club** has once again had a full agenda of activities for the support of the seminarians at Mount Angel Seminary. They have a bowling night. They also host a barbeque for the seminarians and some of the monks from Mount Angel Abbey. The club also sends Christmas cards to each of the seminarians.

The Salem chapter also has established a Vocation Promoter from each parish in the region. This person will have the responsibility of making sure that all vocation information from the Archdiocese will come to the attention of their parishioners. That person will also be involved in the Priesthood Sunday activities.

For several years the Salem Serrans have hosted a Vocation Rally for 6th graders in the local Catholic schools. This activity has blossomed so that the designated parish has a full auditorium of “bubbling, enthusiastic” youngsters.
